

GREETINGS FROM VIET NAM

During his recent travels, Father That Son visited his old hometown where he was born, Nha Trang, located on the coast in south central Vietnam. There, he spent some time at his family's former parish, founded by French missionaries in the 1800's. Pictured here is a photo Father took of



the interior of Rock Cathedral, the church where he was baptized

He talked its pastor into retrieving a very ancient looking register containing his baptismal record. (How old is Father, anyway?) For those who still remember their Latin, this is the inscription:



Father That Son's cousin, Cardinal Francis Xavier Nguyen van Thuan, served as pastor of Rock Cathedral and in 1967 he was appointed Bishop of the Diocese of Nha Trang by Pope Paul VI. In 1975 he was appointed Archbishop of Saigon. Four months later he was detained by the Communists and escorted to a prison in North Vietnam where he was imprisoned for more than 13 years, nine of which were spent in solitary confinement. During his years of imprisonment he wrote The Road of Hope (since translated into 6 languages). Upon release, he became an advisor to Pope John Paul II; Pope Francis named him as Venerable on May 4, 2017, a significant step on the road towards canonization.

Father That Son journeyed further up Viet Nam's coast to Da Nang, where his family lived for many years - and where he received his First Holy Communion. Here is the Sacred Heart Cathedral where his family once went to Mass. This pink church is famous in Viet Nam. Locals call it the "Rooster Church" because its lightening rod looks like a chicken.
