

# **GOSPEL MEDITATION: A MEANINGFUL HARVEST**

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus sends out their faith, support and encourage one disciples in pairs to "every town and place he intended to visit." These disciples were to let the communities know that Jesus and the Apostles were on their way. They were being asked to evangelize — to announce the "Good News" that Jesus was coming.

When Jesus sent out those pairs of disciples as "laborers for his harvest," he wanted them to work together, to share

In the end, the mission of the disciples was to proclaim the faith they held within their hearts and invite others all others - their harvest - to join them in building up God's Kingdom as faithful disciples.
