

## MEDITATION AND THE ROSARY

October is the month of **10NTH** the most holy rosary with a memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary on Oct. 7. During this time of Eucharist Revival, it is especially important to understand the rosary as a powerful meditative tool that turns our minds to the life of Christ.

While meditation grows in popularity as a means to better mental, physical, and spiritual health, many people, including

Catholics, overlook the rosary as a meditative tool. It is sometimes seen as too simple and therefore as superficial. The rosary is simple, but the gentle repetition of its prayers makes it an excellent means to moving into deeper meditation. It gives us an opportunity to open ourselves to God's word and to refine our interior gaze. By focusing on the lives of Christ and Mary through meditation on the mysteries, we learn about ourselves in relation to God.

Mary herself is an excellent model for the daily practice of meditation. She received the word of God through Gabriel. She pondered God's word in her heart. She took in the events around her, capturing them internally and carrying them within her like a treasure. This is the essence of meditationreceiving God's word and making it our treasure.

## A LETTER FROM BISHOP BRENNAN **RESPECT FOR THE LIVES OF MOTHERS AND CHILDREN**

As Catholics throughout the world prepare to celebrate "Respect Life" month beginning Oct. 1, Bishop Mark Brennan is releasing a letter Sept. 30 about respect for the lives of mothers and children. The letter also responds to the recent law signed by Gov. Justice regulating the practice of abortion in West Virginia.

Says Bishop Brennan in his letter: "Mv brothers and sisters. our Church is both pro-child and pro-woman. As the prolife movement long ago realized, seeking only to limit or eliminate abortions is not enough. We must also provide support to mothers before and after they give birth and to their families."


