# Easter

The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread.

LUKE 24:35

Imagine meeting a stranger, a fellow traveler, who butts into the conversation you're having with your friend. The two disciples in today's Gospel are heading to Emmaus, seven miles away from Jerusalem, heartbroken and disillusioned. It's the day of Jesus' resurrection, but no one knew it when these two set out on their journey, maybe going home to resume their pre-Jesus lives because it seemed as if everything was over.

In the middle of trying to make sense of the tragedy, some eavesdropping guy asks them about their troubles. After telling their story, the disciples are amazed to find this stranger able to piece together the fragments of the broken image of their master using scripture as the glue. Then it happens—at dinner they recognize Jesus in the breaking of bread, just before he vanishes. With their hearts burning with love and inspiration, they run back to Jerusalem—at night—to tell the others their new story.

## THE STRANGER/SHEPHERD

The stranger in this story who turns out to be Jesus is reminiscent of the Gospel images of Jesus as the Good

Shepherd. He seeks out his "lost sheep" who have strayed from the faith community, and the experience of the risen Lord transforms them into perhaps the very first evangelists, sharing their Good News with their friends back in Jerusalem.

Are we transformed by the time we leave Mass? We should be! Our hearts should be burning within us from our experience of Jesus in word and sacrament. Yet how often life breaks our heart and clouds our mind! We stumble toward our own Emmaus, unaware that Jesus is with us. We are privileged to experience Jesus in every Eucharist through the breaking open of scripture and by the breaking of the bread. Like the disciples of the story, that transforming experience can compel us to go forth and tell everyone the Good News.

## THE GREATEST FEAST

What is the greatest feast of all in the Church? No, it's not Christmas; it's Easter. Easter is also the oldest feast in the Church. On Easter we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus. By rising from the tomb with a new and glorious life, Jesus triumphed over death. He led us from the slavery of sin to new life. At the Easter Vigil Mass (held the night before Easter) the Pascal (Easter) Candle is lit and carried through the dark church. People hold candles and pass the light of Christ to one another. The "Exultet" an ancient Easter hymn, is sung. Several Scripture passages that trace Salvation History are read, water is blessed, and catechumens are baptized. All present renew their baptismal promises. The Easter season lasts 50 days and ends with Pentecost. During this time, the Pascal Candle is lit at each Mass, and alleluias are said and sung repeatedly.

On Easter morning some people like to view the sunrise, which is a symbol of the risen Son. Other objects associated with Easter are symbolic. New life is represented by flowers, green grass, and rabbits (which are prolific). Eggs from which chicks emerge represent the tomb from which Christ came out with new life. The Easter lily is shaped like a trumpet as if heralding the glory of the Resurrection. It is white, which stands for purity, and gold, the color of glory and royalty. ## A WOMAN OF FAITH

In less than 40 years, Gianna Beretta Molla became a pediatric physician, a wife, a mother and a saint!

She was born in Magenta near Milano, the 10th of Alberto and Maria Beretta's 13 children. An active member of the St. Vincent de Paul Society and a leader in the Catholic Action movement, Gianna also enjoyed skiing and mountain climbing. She earned degrees in medicine and surgery from the University of Pavia, eventually specializing in pediatrics. In 1952, Gianna opened a clinic in the small town of Mesero, where she met engineer Pietro Molla.

Shortly before their 1955 marriage, Gianna wrote to Pietro: "Love is the most beautiful sentiment that the Lord has put into the soul of men and women." In the next four years the Mollas had three children: Pierluigi, Mariolina, and Laura. Two pregnancies following ended in miscarriage.

Early in her sixth pregnancy, doctors discovered that Gianna had both a child and a tumor in her uterus. She allowed the surgeons to remove the tumor but not to perform the complete hysterectomy that they recommended, which would have killed the child. Seven months later in April 1962, Gianna Emanuela Molla was born at the hospital in Monza, but post-operative complications resulted in an infection for her mother. The following week, Gianna Molla died at home in Mesero, where she was buried.

Gianna Emanuela went on to become a physician herself. Gianna Beretta Molla was beatified in 1994 and canonized 10 years later. Her Liturgical Feast Day is April 28.
