

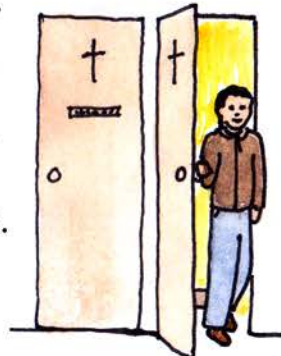
Always be Ready

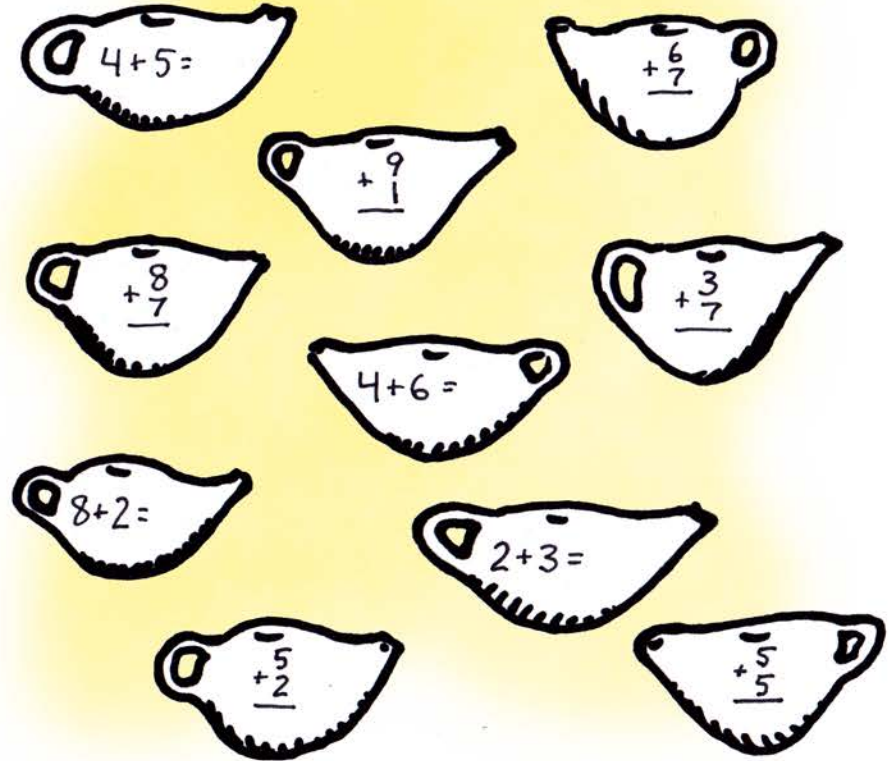
