TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

OCTOBER 4, 2020

The Church presents today's Old Testament and Gospel readings together, as a pair. We delight in the symmetry between the two passages. Jesus, who is the Word of God, knows the Hebrew scriptures by heart and intends for his parable to echo Isaiah. As Jesus begins speaking, he summons the words of Isaiah, knowing his learned audience of chief priests and elders will feel comfortable with a familiar scripture passage. These scholars recognize immediately that Jesus is referring to a prophetic passage about sin, about the chosen people's tendency to turn away from God and grow "wild."

AMAZED BY INNOVATION

What Jesus does next surprises his audience. He adds a new twist to Isaiah's well-known words, adding a new character, the landowner's very own son. Adding this innovation shows that Jesus confirms the prophet's warning—that God longs for "his cherished plant" to grow according to the divine plan. The narrative twist also allows Jesus to reveal the fullness of God's plan in a way

his audience can understand. Like a master teacher, Jesus respects the knowledge and faithfulness of the chief priests and elders, and then builds on what they know. By adding the landowner's son to the parable of the vineyard, Jesus gently expresses his own mission as the Son of God. Matthew's Gospel often depicts the chief priests and elders as oppositional; they worry that Jesus will abolish the law and foment rebellion. As the Lord said earlier in Matthew's Gospel, however, "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. I have come not to abolish but to fulfill" (Matthew 5:17). Jesus' audience is skeptical about him, horrified at the thought of a mere human being claiming that he is the Son of God. Jesus' masterful approach provides an opportunity for his audience to give him the benefit of the doubt. In this way, Jesus proposes—not imposes—his kingship, inviting us all to follow him.

Faith In Action: Jamie Boudreaux

Parishioner Jamie Boudreaux's relationship with God is friendship of the highest order. It is a bond that explains her devotion to Mass and the Eucharist as well as her trademark floppy hat, which those who know her understand is her way of answering the call of St. Paul. "Saint Paul says in scripture women should wear a head covering (to show reverence) when we pray—so I do," Jamie says.

Jamie draws effortlessly upon the words of St. Paul, who along with the Prophet Isaiah are foundational in her friendship with God and her powerful conversion many years ago that guided her fully to Him through charismatic renewal.

"I physically experienced the hand of God," says Jamie. "...and from that moment on I've experienced true healing."

St. Paul is at the center of Catholic charismatic renewal and its promise that the same gifts of the Holy Spirit that empowered the early Church are still available to believers. The now 59-year-old Jamie can attest to the gifts. They lifted her from hardships as a young wife and mother living in Louisiana—hardships that included the premature births of twins, her daughter battling cancer at age 11, ongoing health challenges for the twins and her daughter, and sustained financial struggle that put everything on the brink for her, her family, and for her husband Ricky.

"God brought me to my knees," says Jamie. "I said 'what do You want from me?' I couldn't take it anymore. From that moment on, it wasn't right away, but things started changing." This surrender led her to a healing Mass and receiving the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

"In an instant, you know things ... you just have this knowledge. It's in your heart," Jamie says. "He becomes personal to you."

Jamie turned her outward acts as a Catholic into conversation with God—time dedicated to nurturing the friendship. "If you have a friend and you don't spend much time with them, your friendship is going to dwindle--and it may even disappear. It's the same thing with God," Jamie says, who attends Mass daily and visited often the St. Joseph Adoration Chapel at St. Michael's Church in Wheeling before

last year. It is Jamie who created the St. Joseph's altar at St. Francis to share her traditions for giving thanks. God's hand brought Ricky work as a consultant and project foreman in the oil and gas industry--work that prospered them and later led them for seven years to Moundsville—and Jamie to St. Francis. Ricky's work here is finished, so they are returning to Louisiana. "This place I'm going to miss, because the people here are so kind. I see people following Jesus's teaching here, I see a lot of people helping their neighbors," says Jamie. She and Ricky will be returning in time to help their daughter in a new battle for restored health. Jamie admits she is worried, as any mother would be, but worry is backsliding. Staying true to the gifts isn't without struggle. She is taking it to her friend God.

"I've been through a lot in my life, and if I hadn't had God, who knows where I would be. I got through that because I knew God was leading us. I knew he was going to take care of it. We just need to listen and trust him. ...We are all in his hands." — K. Swift
