

hat a wonderful joy fills us today as we ponder the inexhaustible mercy of God. "Mercy is the heart of God," Pope Francis tells us. Imagine this dynamic, powerful, compassionate, piercing, embracing, loving, propelling, penetrating, absorbing, and enveloping, transforming presence of God flowing into the very depth of our souls. God's mercy reveals all superficiality and falsehood, and lays bare all distortions, empty promises, weakness, and sin.

It is so easy to remain tethered and mired in the past, but there is no need to do so. God is all about tomorrow and the work God has yet to do in our lives.

The resurrected Christ stands before us with nail marks in his wrists and wounds on his body as a testament that not even injustice, suffering and death can trample over and destroy God's mercy. What have we to fear? Why do we keep ourselves from peace? Our lack of faith prevents us from going forward and fully receiving the holiness God desires to breathe upon us. Breathe in God's mercy, allow the wind of God's presence to kiss all of your sins and caress all of your fears. Exhale peace.

### April Is Child Abuse Awareness Month

In 1982, President Reagan proclaimed April

to be the first National Child Abuse Prevention Month, and that tradition continues today across our nation and within our diocese.

As part of this month, it is important to point out the ongoing work by our diocese to combat abuse. Our diocese reports all allegations of abuse directly to law enforcement and cooperates with civil authorities on all investigations of a support of the cooperate of the coopera

authorities on all investigations. It also employs a designated Victim Assistance Coordinator, whose primary role is to accompany survivors and provide resources for their healing journey. There is also an independent review board

consisting primarily of lay members which examines allegations and make recommendations to the bishop, especially regarding the suitability for ministry.

Take a moment to learn here what you can do to help stop child abuse.

Also a priority is training adults to maintain safe environments and to properly report all concerns. A key component of that training is providing resources to parish religion educators and catholic schools so they can instruct minors on

so they can instruct minors on how to identify warning signs of abuse and inappropriate

behavior, as well as report it.

By following all of our diocesan policies and procedures to create safe environments, we are continuing to maintain a culture of protection and healing.
