

GOSPEL MEDITATION: BE EXCITED, CAPTIVATED

People knew over a year in advance that the Pope was coming for a visit to America and the preparations began. Security, protocols, crowd management, itineraries, invitations, regulations, and so much more was necessary to pull this event off effectively. It's not every day that we get a visit from such a prominent dignitary. Thought, effort, meticulous attention to detail and vision all are necessary to make this thing work. After all, he can't just show up in the ordinary and normal daily routines of life and catch people unprepared! Tickets have to be purchased, buses rented, hotel rooms reserved, and travel arrangements made early because it will be impossible to see him if we wait too long!

We do this kind of preparing not only for prominent religious figures but for political dignitaries, notable sports figures, people of

fame, and even actors. If an individual intrigues us, we are going to want to do all we have to do to get a "good seat" in the house. Does Jesus Christ captivate this much of our attention? We are asked to prepare the way of the Lord and to do so not with frantic frenzy but patient enthusiasm. We do not have to stand on a street corner making profound announcements about God's coming or become overly zealous in our embrace of the Good News. Our task is quieter, more interior, captivating, and consuming. We are asked to change. We have to conduct our lives with holy devotion.

Is the cost of that ticket too much for you? Don't you want the "best seat" in the house? You don't want to miss Our Lord's arrival when he comes, do you? After all, if he comes while you are going about your daily routines without you even knowing, he may catch you

off guard. Or, he may come in disguise looking like a beggar, a prisoner, migrant, refugee, or someone who is lost. Would you be ready to recognize him then?

Preparing for the coming of Christ requires a change of mind, heart, and behavior. We want our lives to speak of the exciting news of Christ's coming and the joy that the Gospel brings. It has to do with our demeanor, values, priorities, choices, and how we structure daily routines. Of course, it involves sacrifice. All anticipations do! Be excited, captivated, enthusiastic, and sitting on the edge of your seat eager to celebrate his coming among us at Christmas, and waiting for him to come again.

Holiday Raffle Removes Barriers to Giving

The Northern Programs Gabriel Project is reaching out for help a little differently this year with its Holiday Basket Raffle fundraiser. The Holiday Basket Raffle is a way to meet increased demand for services during a time when partner organizations are limited in their ability to hold in-person donation drives to help Gabriel Project clients.

"All the baskets are created with love for the little ones we serve," says Faith Hicks, chapter coordinator for the Northern Panhandle.

Community groups and businesses in each program area met the call of volunteers to create baskets. Most baskets have a regional theme, while others are more universal in appeal, Hicks says.

Donations to purchase raffle tickets will allow the various regional programs to buy items needed specifically in their area. There also are opportunities to directly donate to the purchase of needed supplies.

go.rallyup.com/20e94 is the place to go online to view basket descriptions for each region and to buy tickets or donate. Tickets are for sale until 1 p.m. Dec. 18, with the raffle the same day at 9 p.m. Ticket prices are as follows: 10 entries \$10; 30 entries for \$25; 75 entries \$50; 200 entries for \$100. The Moundsville area basket is especially overflowing with items estimated to value \$455.

Hicks says this type of funding appeal keeps everyone safer by limiting contact with the supplies for clients.

A COLLECTION FOR RETIRED

Religious will be taken up next weekend, Dec, 12-13. Bishop Brennan is asking everyone to remember the important roles of these servants and to give generously to the fund, which supports them in old age.

The religious take a personal vow of poverty and historically receive little more than room and board from the parishes, schools, hospitals, and charitable works in which they serve. This means they do not have financial resources for their later years when many of them are dealing with illnesses or need extra care. The Bishop asks all of us to view the collection as an act of gratitude for the honorable, Christ-centered service of the religious. We are also asked to see it as a practical way to assist them in their present condition.
