How different today's Gospel story would be if Jesus gave in to what was politically correct at that time. The leper would have been turned away and a soul, already beaten down by disease and fear, would have experienced an even deeper wound. Jesus wouldn't have captured much attention from anyone, nor would he have mirrored the Father's compassion and love.

Our Gabriel Project mission appreciates regular supplies. These are just some of the places where we can live Lent. The tradition during Lent is to give something up. However, it also can be useful to reverse the tradition and find something meaningful to add. Receiving ashes at the beginning of Lent is a commitment to repent and strengthen our belief in the Gospel. The ashes are a sign of our sinfulness, our humility, and mortality. We are encouraged to focus on three special behaviors during Lent: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Within these behaviors, we can pursue those things that bring closeness to God and a life more fully as He intended. Says St. Catherine of Siena: "Be who God meant you to be and you will set the world on fire!"

Distribution of Ashes Modified for Pandemic

Distribution of ashes will be different this year because of pandemic. Here is what to expect:

- * Father will say the prayer blessing the ashes.
- * He will sprinkle the ashes with holy water, without speaking.
- He then will address all those present and only once say the formula as it appears in the Roman Missal, applying it to all in general:

"Remember that you are dust,
