

GOSPEL MEDITATION: LIFE THROUGH CLEAR EYES

The Season of Lent is a time for Christians to get back to basics, focusing on the quality of our discipleship. This means that Lent isn't an end in itself. Rather, Lent—which comes from an Old English word meaning "springtime" — is ultimately oriented toward our celebrations of the Resurrection at Easter and our renewal of our Baptism Promises on Easter Sunday. We are reminded of this by the words of the Mass, as we recall that God "gives us this joyful season when we prepare to celebrate the paschal mystery with mind and heart renewed... as our lives and on the realities of the world

we recall the great events that gave us new life in Christ" (Preface of Lent I).

As we know, the traditional bona opera ("good works") of Lent are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These actions focus our attention on what is most important in our relationships with God and others, while enabling us to set aside some of what consumes our time and energy or distracts us from what is truly important.

Today's readings are inviting us to look at

around us with clear eyes and to reflect on the fruit of our lives. Are there areas in our lives that need to be more carefully nurtured and tended? Are their "branches" that need to be pruned, so that other areas of our lives — including our prayer and ministry - can be more fruitful? How can we more effectively respond to the needs of those around us, sharing our time, talent, and material goods to help others to bear greater fruit in their own lives?

Church Windows Embody Messages

This week's Favorite Saints contributor is inspired by messages in stained-glass windows, especially those of our church.

Have you ever arrived for Mass early and felt the presence of God around you? Yes, it's in the tabernacle, but it's also in the building surrounding you. God's message is in the windows. Have you ever looked closely at them? Those beautiful stained-glass windows have a lot to say.



In the window of The Annunciation the angel can clearly be seen telling Mary she has been chosen to be the Mother of God. Observe the

background: A tree with a limb that's shaped like a snake and an apple. Perhaps Mary as the new Eve? The work of this window's artist, Max Guler, remains prized. Guler, who emigrated to Chicago in 1896, ran his own studio and used only imported antique glass. His signature is on the very

bottom of the right side. (Note the photo at the top of this article.)

In The Nativity window, at right, St. Joseph has a green



halo. Why? St. Joseph is typically robed in green. This artist robed him in brown. Green symbolizes faithfulness to God's call. while brown was the color most humble working men wore. Joseph's story better told this way perhaps?



This window of St. Francis Xavier shows him baptizing a native, presumably in Asia. The decorative leaves suggest a tropical scene. St. Francis also

reached Japan. Many folks believe Mt. Fuji is in the background.

In the window of The Good Shepherd, one sheep is hidden among the others. This sheep is black. Have you seen it? God's love and care



extends to all races and to all nationalities.

There is more to come later about the messages in our windows. In the meantime, look to see what messages you can find. What are the messages for you?

of pastoral concerns is starting to provide insights. The Pastoral Concerns Committee of the Diocesan Pastoral Council reports that a full analysis of responses is expected soon. The University of Notre Dame is analyzing the responses, and the diocese is looking forward to sharing results sometime in May.

Participation in the survey was robust with approximately 2,000 responses. Of those, 1,400 were electronically submitted, and the other 600 paper surveys were mailed and manually entered into the system. The committee thanks everyone again for their participation.
