

Today's Gospel passage gets one thinking about the elements that truly determine the success of an endeavor. Have you done a thing successfully because you have finished it? Because it has made you his voice. money? Because people are talking about it? Does real success demand one or all of these criteria be fulfilled?

But consider this: the Gospel passage simply doesn't work without his wasted hours. If he had not spent a whole night pulling empty nets onto his boat, doubting himself, growing ever more tired and ever more discouraged, the whole impact of the next day's catch would have been lost.

Praise God for Peter's unsuccessful night. Praise God for his empty nets. Praise God that he had enough trust in something other than his own ability to try one more time.

How is success defined? That is a question for the last day, when all our actions and undertakings will be laid bare by the only One who knows everything. Perhaps the best answer when the time comes will be: "I don't know. But I did as You asked."



## A Letter From St. Pio and God's Will

Continuing our idea to use ordinary time to learn about saints, we begin our Favorite Saints Series, where parishioners share with us the stories of the

saints they most treasure and why.

The members of my family have a special relationship with St. Padre Pio of Pietrelcina, Italy. He was born May 25th, 1887 to parents who were peasant farmers. Born Francesco Forgione, he was given the name of Pius (Italian: Pio) when he joined the Order of Friars Minor Capuchin. By the time he was five years old, he had already decided to dedicate his entire life to God.

His advice on the practical application of theology is often summed up in his now famous quote: "Pray, Hope, and Don't Worry." He directs us to recognize God in all things and to desire above all things to do the will of God.

Padre Pio became famous worldwide for exhibiting the stigmata (the five wounds of Christ) for most of his life, thereby generating much interest and controversy. Many people who heard of him traveled to San Giovanni Rotondo to meet him and confess to him, ask for help, or have their curiosity satisfied. My mother wrote to Padre Pio in the early to middle 1960s. She told him she was a nurse (Padre Pio

had founded a hospital) and her husband was an accountant and asked should they move from America to Italy to live and work in his community. Family lore has it that Padre Pio wrote back and the message was "No, stay in America and do God's will." (By the time I was told this story the letter was long gone, and it is not clear who actually wrote it.)

The course of my life was very affected by Padre Pio. If we had moved to Italy, I am sure that I would have never met and married my husband, had my son, or moved to Moundsville! And I would be speaking Italian! I wish my son, Andrew, a happy Feast Day every year on Padre Pio's Feast Day, Sept. 23, and remind him he would not be here except for this great saint.

St Padre Pio, pray for us.
