

Solidarity Will Defeat Poverty, Says Francis

Poverty

fraternity with the impoverished.

"Live in solidarity with the poor" and end the "globalization of indifference" toward them, says Francis. This is his challenge for Poverty Awareness Month in 2021.

Says Francis of poverty: "The many situations of inequality, poverty and injustice are signs not only of a profound lack of fraternity, but also of the absence of a culture of solidarity." He adds: These inequalities will continue to "weaken social bonds" as long as "new ideologies, characterized by rampant individualism, egocentrism and materialistic consumerism" prevail in society.

Recall that before he was Pope Francis, Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio lived humbly among the poor in a small apartment, using public transportation and cooking his own meals. Living humbly, Francis says, teaches us how much we really need and how much we have to share. Here in our own Appalachian backyard, we know this is true. Before pandemic, more than 296 thousand West Virginians, 16 percent, were living below the poverty line--an

estimated four thousand of those in Marshall County. The gaps created by our state's culture of poverty weave throughout our community in a way that often only solidarity with the poor can detect. For those less removed from the gap he describes, Francis reminds us there is always more we can do to awake consciousness.

You can join the U.S. Bishops, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development, and the Catholic community in the United States in taking up Francis' call by visiting the page for Poverty Awareness Month through the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. Resources for all levels of outreach are available, including an invitation to join the USCCB public action advocacy network. An events calendar also is available for download and includes links for each day's observance.
