

GOSPEL MEDITATION: EMBRACING THE UNSURE

Many will say the work of preaching the Gospel is best left to the professionals-priests, religious, deacons, and lay ministers. However, as baptized members of the Body of Christ, everyone is called to preach. The question is not should we do but how do we do it?

There is the sure way and an unsure way to preach the Gospel. The sure way pretty much keeps the Gospel in church and around like-minded people. Say prayers, go to Mass, contribute to the food pantry, tithe, and attend Bible Study. That pretty much covers the bases, right?

The unsure way is the more challenging. Imagine those first disciples going out and into people's homes. They must have had some amazing conversations with folks about God's kingdom, changing their hearts, forgiving sins, and looking at the world differently. They must have met people who were hurting, exiled from their communities, neglected, lost. We know many welcomed these conversations, but we also know there were many others who rejected them-literally pushed them aside.

How Catholic Art Saved Our Faith

Though we are not all artists or art experts, every Catholic 💹 can appreciate the beauty in art. Art is a wonderful expression of what we believe—how it makes us feel, how it can tell a story, and also invoke a memory. During the Reformation, when factions warred against the Catholic Faith, the best artists were tasked to stir emotions by creating beautiful works depicting Salvation History. Some of these works of art and artists are highlighted in How Catholic Art Saved the Faith: The Triumph of Beauty and Truth in Counter-Reformation Art by Elizabeth Lev. It tells the story of how our faith was saved by drawing people back

into the Church through images of the beauty and fullness of our faith. Here are just a few examples from the book:

Sacred Spaces

It was during this period when the



medieval veils and separations were removed to bring people closer to the Eucharist. The Church of the

Gesù (above) was the first to remove physical separations to bring people closer to communion with the Body of Christ.

Many of the images of the saints intertwine our earth with the heavens, giving us a glimpse of what is to come. At right is *Noli Me Tangere by Lavinia*
