



following brief descriptions to
guide your looking at the
windows noted to see what is in
them for you:



Three windows overlook the choir loft. These windows focus on three historic figures who influenced Church music. The figure in the far-left window is King David, who wrote the psalms. The center is St. Cecilia, patroness of music. The window on the right is Pope St. Gregory I of Gregorian chant.

The window above depicting Christ appearing before Saint Margaret Mary of Alacoque is a fascinating example of devotion to the Sacred Heart. She was a French Sister of the Visitation who lived in the 1600s.



On either side of the main altar the evangelists are shown with pen and paper. All are barefoot, as the altar and tabernacle are "Holy Ground." (God told Moses to remove his sandals near the burning bush as it was "Holy Ground.")
