GOSPEL MEDITATION: A ROSARY WITH CREATION

In creative celebration of the Most Holy Trinity, pray a rosary with creation. Find a quiet place outside or sit near a window. Contemplate the Divine Gift before vou. Admire it. Study it. Become one with it. Ask for the guidance of Brother St. Francis as you pray: "You, Holy Father, are King of heaven and earth. You are three in one, God above all gods. You are good, all good, and supreme good, Lord God, living and true. You are love. You are beauty. You are gentleness. You are joy. You are hope and happiness." Admire the wonder

and majesty of God in all that is around vou. Ask for wisdom and understanding as you pray through each decade.

Decade one: Contemplate God the Father. Lift your eyes, heart, and soul to the magnificence of the universe, its expanse and its endlessness.

Decade two: Contemplate God the Son. become one with the incarnate divine life that flows through you and flows with the smallest of creatures.

Decade three: Contemplate God the Holy Spirit. Behold the living, dying, and

rising to new life. You are one with all time from beginning into eternity.

Decade Four: Contemplate God as One. Decade Five: Contemplate God as three. We are all connected: God of the Holy

Trinity, creation, our brothers and sisters, the animals, and the plants.

This rosary celebrates the circle and our connectedness with all things: a glimpse of the Trinity.
