

### **End-of-Life Care Focus of Series**

A new miniseries aims to help people

understand the need for a wholeperson approach to end-of-life and palliative care for the gravely ill.

Whole Person Care: Living and Dying in the State of Grace debuts on EWTN Global Catholic Network from June 14-18 at 5:30 p.m. It also will be available for streaming at ondemand.ewtn.com.

The series discusses how Catholic health care in end-of-life and palliative care stages upholds the dignity and sanctity of human life. It is based on the Whole Person Care Initiative implemented by the bishops of California and Catholic health leaders, which serves as a guide for the series to explore the theological and spiritual themes of a happy death and to cover health care choices for families. The aim is to offer a solution to findings of a 2014 study by the Institute of Medicine that


