#### GOSPEL MEDITATION: THE GOOD SHEPHERD'S VOICE

What does Jesus' voice sound like to you?

There are many voices that call for our attention throughout the day. We find ourselves being pulled in hundreds of directions trying our best to give our full attention to those voices and addressing their needs. Jesus' voice is that tiny, still voice that speaks in the silence of the heart, which is the organ to hear his voice, not the mind and not the ears. It does not demand our attention, but patiently waits for our attention to be given. His voice speaks nothing else but

love, but our hearts drown out his voice because the other voices are clanging and clamoring, and our tendency is to go where the volume is loudest because it is certain, not where the volume to softest.

As one matures in the spiritual life, they discover the voices that call for our attention can be whittled down to three: the voice of the world, the voice of the Evil one, and the voice of God. It takes time to learn how to discern among these, but this skill is of utmost importance for us to navigate the

complexities of the modern world and of our daily lives. Having regular faith conversations with a men's or women's sharing group is certainly helpful, as is seeing a spiritual director regularly. But most importantly, this skill is learned in moments of personal prayer. It is in these moments, when the heart finally seeks the Lord, He will speak. When you've listened, then act. Do what He tells you. Follow the example of the Good Shepherd, who did His Father's will.

patient mom, the most caring mom ever. I wouldn't be where I am today if it wasn't for Mom. She begged me for four years to take the entrance exam for nursing. I didn't have confidence in myself to take the test, but Mom did and pushed me. They took 16 applicants out of 150, and I was one of them. I thank Mom to this day for the push she gave me into my career.

Jay Bierce said: My mom Joanna taught me how to sew at a very young age. It has carried over still today, from all the things I make out of leather from the "passport belt bag" that has taken me to Israel several times to my buckskins, which have taken me to many places. So I guess by Mom teaching me how to sew, she has made me a world traveler.

Jay's wife complimented her mother in law of 40 years. She is most grateful to her for raising Jay. Linda says: Without Joanna, I would not have my loving husband and my three most beautiful children and grandchildren. She taught me to bake when I ran a small baking business.
