

National Vocations Awareness Week

Former Reverend Sets Timeless Example



In honor of this week of vocations awareness. we look to the past and to a man who, having died over one hundred years ago, can still teach us something about service and love of the Church.

Rev. Francis J. Flanagan was born in Kingston, Ontario in 1876. As a young boy, Flanagan heard the call of God and entered De La Salle College, where he joined the novitiate of the Order of Christian Brothers. After six years serving as a brother, he began studying for the priesthood at Kitchner College and later St. Laurent's Seminary in Quebec until being

ordained on June 28, 1903. After serving in various parishes around West Virginia, Fr. Flanagan was assigned to serve St. Francis in 1910.

In 1915, because of the growing number of Catholic immigrants moving to Moundsville at the turn of the century, plans were made by Flanagan to construct a larger church that would be more centrally located in the city. The original church built in the 1840s was located on the corner of 10th Street and Lockwood Avenue. After three tireless years, Flanagan was finally able to see his works come to fruition and celebrated Mass for the first time in the new St. Francis Church in January 1918. Sadly, only two months later, Father hit his head while descending the staircase in the rectory, which caused internal bleeding. He died several days later at the young age of 41.

Father Flanagan was noted in his obituary as having "a childlike piety, firmness of character, quiet dignity and devotion to duty." According to one parishioner of the day, "he literally lived with sunshine, radiated good humor and inspired confidence and love of fellow man."

Voting ends Nov. 15. Thank you in advance for taking time to cast your vote.


BISHOP BRENNAN is asking that no campaign flyers or other materials related to Tuesday's general election be placed on vehicles during church services. Let us know if you see any.
