GOSPEL MEDITATION: AWAKEN

Staying awake can often be a challenge, especially when we are exhausted. Being tired affects us physically, psychologically, and spiritually. Getting sufficient physical rest only helps so much. We need rejuvenation in other ways. If we are psychologically exhausted, we need to understand what is draining us. If we are spiritually tired, we need to find the boost to put us back in touch with God and His love. Unfortunately, exhaustion is seldom limited to just one part of who we are. When we lack energy and zeal it is usually the case that everything suffers.

And yet, our Lord's directive is clear, "Be vigilant at all times." Even Jesus knew

what "the anxieties of daily life" can do to us. One day pours into another, and time quickly passes. Any one of us can take a moment and reflect on how many wonderful opportunities we miss to awaken because of so much to do and so little time to do it. We justify sleep walking through life, separated often from love, by convincing ourselves that tomorrow is another day and there'll be more time. However, tomorrow is here, and time is running out. We're on a limited ride and time is short.

Jesus is clear on another point. "That day [will] catch you by surprise like a trap." St. Teresa of Calcutta tells us, "We desire

to be able to welcome Jesus ... in a heart full of love and humility, a heart so pure, so immaculate, so warm with love for one another."

Getting to this place requires vigilance and discipline. It takes a knowledge of what is really of importance and what truly needs the focus of our energy and time. Pray, starting now and not tomorrow, that we can stay alert, be strengthened in our faith, and prepared for whatever will come. Don't miss another opportunity to love.

Shrine Reminds Us Mary Lived Advent

As Advent begins, it is our good fortune that Father and a few from our parish

visited Mary's House during a recent pilgrimage that included Turkey. This place is where Mary eventually lived out her days after

Jesus spoke of her from the Cross to John. Today it is one of the world's holiest shrinesvisited by more than a million people a year. It is revered by both Christians and Muslims. and Pope Paul VI and Pope John

Paul II both worshiped there. making special journeys to do so.

It is also our good fortune that Father found the book Marv's House by Donald Carroll, which tells "the extraordinary story behind the discovery of the house where the

Virgin Mary lived and died." (subtitle) Carroll, who was an expert on Turkey, writes "the shortest leap of

faith" confirms the house was Mary's. Here is his synopsis of the history: "In the closing years of the nineteenth century, the Aegean coast

time. Two of these - the discoveries of the ruins of Ephesus and Troy made international headlines overnight. The third, however, in 1881, was immediately (book photo) enveloped in secrecy....

nobody in the Vatican believed that an obscure French priest, (Abbé Julien Gouvet) following the visions of an equally obscure German nun and mystic, (Anne Catherine Emmerich) could possibly have found the actual house where the Virgin Mary spent her last years. Yet by the end of the century the evidence had become so compelling that scholars had pronounced the discovery authentic, and Pope Leo XIII had declared the site a place of pilgrimage."
