

GOSPEL MEDITATION: STOP COUNTING COSTS

The Eucharist is at the center of our faith lives. At Mass, we recall how Jesus humbled himself to enter into the muck of our world. Along with the bread and wine, we offer ourselves together with Jesus as a living sacrifice to the Father. We pledge that we will give of ourselves in service to the needy, the lonely, and the desperate so that the blessings of eternal life may be extended throughout the world. When we come to Mass, we are not bystanders or spectators. Rather our lives are at stake. We are proclaiming that Christ has died to save us and that we are willing to sacrifice ourselves in service to others.

Jesus makes this very clear to his disciples in today's gospel reading. Though he was the most powerful man to ever walk the earth, Christ did not become human to

dominate others. He came to seek out the sick, the suffering, and the sinners. He came not only to instruct and heal us, but he suffered the cruelest death imaginable to open up heaven to those who would believe. Jesus was not in it for the glory.

As members of a faith community, we can relate to the bickering that went on among the disciples. We love our church, and many of us give long hours to support it. Many of us are generous when it comes time to give to special collections or help out with fundraisers. However, it happens more often than we would like to admit that generous people get overlooked and feel slighted. We can feel bitter that others get the recognition we believe we deserve. While it is natural to want recognition for our work, it is not what the follower of

Jesus is called to seek. All the great saints prayed that they would be overlooked. What they wanted more was to be recognized by God and give without counting the cost. Each of us who calls Jesus "Lord" must do the same.

At every Mass, we gather to recall the sacrifice that Jesus made to save us. Are we willing to give of ourselves for others? Are we willing to go without so that we can give more generously to the needy? Are we willing to go without being recognized because we set our hearts on the reward that only God can give? Above all, can we do all this with a spirit of joy and thankfulness because we are blessed to be able to know, love and serve our Lord?

People of Zimbabwe

Zimbabwe is 150,872 square miles. It is a little more than the size of Montana. It is divided into provinces which are something equivalent to counties of a state. The map below shows the eight main provinces and their capital cities marked

by a red square sign on the map. The two large metropolitan cities of Bulawayo in

the west and Harare in the north have been given status of province

because of their large

population numbers. Harare is the capitol city of Zimbabwe.

Languages of Zimbabwe

Provinces were created largely according to the languages/dialects people speak.

There are 16 official languages in Zimbabwe, which has a population of about 13 million. Ndebele and

Shona are most prominent, and Shona language has many dialects. Shona is spoken by 10.8 million people of Zimbabwe (70 percent) and 20 percent speak Ndebele. The SJI Sisters now in the United States speak Karanga dialect.

Because of Zimbabwe's longstanding status as a British colony. English became the primary

language of government Mashonaland and education system.

Location of the SJI **Projects**

The antenatal, orphanage, and Manical and schools' projects are in the Midlands responding to the needs of the urban and rural communities.

Alfred Walter Hostel for the mentally challenged children, and Bethany House of Prayer are in Masvingo Province.

It is also good to know that Zimbabwe is home to one of the Seven Wonders of the World, the mighty Victoria Falls (Mosi-oa-Tunva--the smoke that thunders) in local languages. The falls are on the mighty Zambezi River.


