GOSPEL MEDITATION: LOVE COMES FROM GOD

Archbishop Fulton Sheen said, "It takes three to make love, not two: you, your spouse, and God." Apart from the incarnation of God in Jesus Christ, nothing speaks better of God's incarnate love than marriage. God designed it this way. We place great value on love and rightly so. What we fail to realize, however, is that love, its very presence and place in our lives, is not simply part of the human package deal. Love comes from God. It is one of God's greatest gifts to human beings. When we begin to realize that our very ability to love is sacred, it changes up how we see the essence of life, and purpose and sanctity of marriage.

God is love. It stands to reason then that if we follow the path of unconditional, selfemptying love we will then stumble upon

God. It is precisely this intimate wedding of sinfulness, and weakness. All of this God with love that gives such eloquence and honor to the love between husband and wife. As a living sign of Christ's love for the Church and for humanity, husbands and wives speak volumes of God's unconditional incarnate love for all of his children! The Divine power that brings unity and life to marriage is so strong that once joined, it really cannot be separated.

Admittedly, marriage covenants can be extremely difficult to negotiate and, at times, very painful to experience. God's perfect divinity always meets our broken and imperfect humanity. God is okay with this setup as he created it this way. Our loving is never as unconditional as God's and often tainted by our own imperfections, needs, memories, hurts,

baggage negatively impacts even the most well-intentioned marriages, causing them to be hurtful and empty. We are love works in progress. God can succeed in perfecting our love only if we keep our eyes fixed on him as the source of that love. That's why marriage is always about three and not just

Honor, celebrate, and support those who have accepted a vocation to marriage. Living in a world that easily pulls relationships apart, may they find hope and inspiration from their faith companions who are on the same journey!

SJI Live Simply, Devoutly

This is the second in a series offered by Sr. Agatha about her religious order located in Zimbabwe.

SJI Congregation Governance

The SJI Congregation is governed by an elected leadership team that is led by a superior general. The team is responsible for the sisters' welfare, including shelter, food, clothes, health, and education. All wages/salaries earned by the Sisters go to the congregation, and the general council oversees the congregation finances. The only property SJI sisters can claim are her clothes and shoes.

Communities of the SJI Sisters

SJI Sisters live in community. There are about 50 SJI communities in Zimbabwe, four in Mozambique, and two in the United States--one in Charleston at Sacred Heart Co-Cathedral and the other at Immaculate Conception in Clarksburg. Communities are further grouped into deaneries, where at least two or more communities gather for meetings to ensure no community feels isolated.

Initial Formation

Generally, girls who join the SJI congregation do so after high school. Initial Formation is the first stage a girl undertakes to prepare herself for first profession of religious vows. Initial formation includes candidateship, postulancy and novitiate. Each group lives in its own house of formation under the guidance of a formator (candidate mistress, postulant mistress and novice mistress). In the first stage of formation, the candidate or aspiring girl undergoes intensive Christian formation so that she becomes a strong Catholic Christian before she embraces religious life. Depending on the background of the girl, one may need four years of

formation. She will also learn other skills to live in a group. The candidateship

period normally is two years, after which the girl requests to be accepted into postulancy for a period of one year. After postulancy, the girl requests to become novitiate for two years. Novices learn about the congregations' constitutions, religious vows, community life, prayer life, and other skills including cookery, sewing, gardening, and flower arrangement. After the novitiate period, a novice can request to make her first profession of religious vows. Final vows are made in the sixth year of religious life—when a sister pledges to be a permanent member.

Spiritual Ongoing formation

Sisters must attend seminars given by experts from among the sisters and from outsiders. There also are special seminars for teachers and ancillary staff sisters, nurses, and for sisters engaged in pastoral ministry. Ancillary staff sisters include secretaries, clerks, accountants, and cooks in hospitals or schools. Every sister must make an annual retreat to deepen her relationship with the Lord.

Prayer Life of SJI Sisters

A community prays morning praise (Divine Office Lauds) before Mass or after depending on each community's circumstances. If possible, sisters pray together Midday Divine Office. Sisters must pray evening prayer (Divine Office Vespers) and night prayer (Compline) together every evening. In some communities, sisters pray night prayer before going to bed. An SJI also must commit at least 30 minutes daily to meditation on a scripture passage.

facilitating our listening sessions.


The synod in Rome will continue until October 2023. The diocesan phase will continue until April 2022. Please pray for Loretta and Rick as they prepare to guide us in this important work.
