# **MEDITATION: SAY THE WORD**

Sept. 18 is Catechetical Sunday, and this year's theme draws our attention to the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist: "This is my body given for you." (Luke 22:19).

During this time of Eucharistic Revival, Catechetical Sunday calls us to understand that all those who share the Catholic faith and the Church's teachings are catechists, beginning with parents as the first catechists. Parents

especially must teach their children about the role of a catechist and identify those teachers of the faith who are present in their family lives. Children also must be shown the people in their community who behave as catechists. Help your children understand that there are individuals among them who teach about Jesus by they way they live.

All of us behaving as catechists is vitally important as we face a growing decline

of Eucharistic faith and devotion, potentially attributed to misunderstanding of Church teaching. We all must be more intentional about catechizing and evangelizing about the Eucharist-the source and summit of Christian life.

Catechetical Sunday is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the role that each person plays, by virtue of Baptism, in handing on the faith and the gift of the Eucharist.
