

and furnishings. The SJI Sisters also are excited to add two more housing units to land donated to them to build the orphanage. So far, there are two units housing six children each. This way of providing homes for orphaned children creates a family setting. It is remarkable what the SJI Sisters are providing despite little government funding or allowances through the social welfare system.


