

GOSPEL MEDITATION: SPREADING THE GOOD NEWS

For over 80 years, Alcoholics Anonymous has helped people overcome addictions to alcohol, drugs, and other destructive behaviors. When people working the program achieve a certain level of serenity and healing, they learn that it is not enough to simply stop drinking or using drugs. If they are to know true and lasting healing, they cannot keep their stories to themselves. They have to reach out to others with the good news. The same is true with those who are healed by Jesus. They are so overcome with joy after their encounter with him that they have to tell everyone about it. It is interesting that throughout the Gospel of Mark, Jesus commands people not to tell anyone who he is and what he has done for them. He

needed it to be clear that he was not a political Messiah who would liberate them from Roman rule, but a suffering servant who would free them from the tyranny of sin. Nonetheless, those whom Jesus heals cannot help but tell everyone they meet about the prophet who restored them to health. For them, telling the story of Jesus' healing power is part of the healing process itself.

This Sunday's gospel is no different. Jesus opens the ears of a deaf man and heals his speech impediment. Throughout his whole life he was unable to hear the sounds all around him. Now the first voice he hears is that of Jesus commanding his ears to be opened. He cannot help but tell everyone about the miracle that God performed.

Jesus continues to be in our midst exercising his healing powers. Because of our own prayers or those of others, we may find ourselves finally able to forgive someone who has hurt us. Or we may find the ability to let go of a burden of anger which we have been carrying for years. Or we may simply be overcome with a sense of God's infinite mercy and believe that our sins have been forgiven. In one way or another, each of us has been touched by Jesus and healed. Now it is up to us to tell others about it so that they too may meet Jesus, the healer. If we want to hold on to the healing we have received, and if we want it to deepen in our lives, we must spread the good news about what Jesus has done for us. - Douglas Sousa/edited

St. Joseph Pilgrimages Planned

Celebrate the Year of St. Joseph with faithful from across the Diocese of

Wheeling-Charleston by making a pilgrimage to significant churches in the state named for the Guardian of the Redeemer and Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Consider embarking on a St. Joseph pilgrimage at one of three notable churches under his patronage with Mass and special tours of the churches on the second Sunday of each month from September to November (Sept. 12, Oct. 10, and Nov. 14.)

• St. Joseph Church, 225 S. Queen St., Martinsburg. Mass at 10:30 a.m. • The Cathedral of St. Joseph, 13th and Eoff streets, Wheeling. Mass at 10:30 a.m. • St. Joseph the Worker Parish, 229 California Ave., Weirton. Mass at 11:00 a.m.

Bishop Mark Brennan encourages Catholics in West Virginia to visit the churches, chapels, and missions in the diocese named in honor of St. Joseph. This act of faith and spiritual renewal will gain a plenary indulgency under the usual conditions: sacramental confession, reception of Holy Communion, prayer for the intentions of the pope, and total detachment from all sin, including venial sin. The faithful are also invited to join fellow Catholics in the Parkersburg Vicariate for a special pilgrimage to St. Joseph

Chapel at 101 W. Penn Ave., Pennsboro, from 3-5 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 12. Volunteers will lead a rosary at 3:45 p.m. followed by the Litany to St. Joseph and silent prayer. A tour of the church and reception will follow.

Pope Francis declared a Year of St. Joseph for the worldwide Church, which began Dec. 8, 2020, and will conclude Dec. 8, 2021. Bishop Brennan has extended the Year of St. Joseph in our diocese to conclude on the Solemnity of St. Joseph March 19, 2022. The culmination of the Year of St. Joseph will be celebrated with Mass and other special events at the Co-cathedral of the Basilica of the Sacred Heart in Charleston. "May our faith in God and our


